HOW TO MAKE A MAY PILGRIMAGE

1. Invite a couple of friends or family members to accompany you to a local shrine or church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

2. Keeping a spirit of prayer and penance, pray one of the mysteries of the rosary on the way there and another on the way back.

3. At the shrine itself, or before the picture or statue of our Lady that is visited, pray the mysteries of the rosary for that day of the week, plus the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

"THE MAY PILGRIMAGE": SOWING PEACE AND JOY IN THE WORLD



On May 2, 1935, St. Josemaria Escriva began the custom in Opus Dei of the May Pilgrimage to Mary. Accompanied by two friends, who were also his students, he went to visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Sonsoles in Avila, Spain. His intention for this visit was to give special thanks to Mary for the favors received that year through her intercession.

St. Josemaria explained: "Having decided to go to Sonsoles, I wanted to celebrate Holy Mass before setting out toward Avila. During the Mass, in the *Memento of the Living*, with a determination that was particularly strong (more than just my own), I asked our Lord, Jesus, to increase in us - in the Work (Opus Dei) - our love for Mary, and I asked that this love might be expressed in deeds.

When we were on the train, my thoughts kept spontaneously returning to the same idea: that our Lady is no doubt pleased with our affection, crystallized as it is in substantial Marian devotions: her image always kept before us; the tender greetings we give her as we enter and leave the room; the poor of our Lady; the Saturday collection; *omnes...* ad lesum per Mariam (all... for Jesus through Mary).

But in the month of May, something more was needed. Then I thought of the *May Pilgrimage* as a custom that must be incorporated - and it has been incorporated - into the Work."

Upon arriving in Avila, St. Josemaria and his friends headed straight for the road leading to the shrine. From far off they could see the shrine on the top of the hill. They prayed the *joyful mysteries* of the rosary along way, the *sorrowful mysteries* in the shrine before the beautiful statue of our Lady, and the *glorious mysteries* on the way back to the train station.

"As we walked from Avila, we kept our eyes fixed on the shrine," St. Josemaria explained, "and, naturally, when we reached the foot of the hill, Mary's house disappeared from view. We talked about how this is what God often does with us. He gives us a clear sight of the end of our journey, and allows us to fix our gaze upon it, in order to set our feet firmly on the path of his most lovable will. And then, when we get near him, he leaves us in darkness, seemingly abandoning us. This is the time of temptation: doubts, struggles, obscurity, weariness, the desire to lie down along the way... But no: forward! The time of temptation is also the time of faith and of trusting surrender to our Father-God.

Away with doubts, vacillations, and indecision! I have seen the way. I set out on it, and I am following it, up the hill - come on, hurry up! - panting, out of breath with the effort, but not stopping to pick the flowers which, to the right and to the left, offer me a moment's rest and the enchantment of their scent and color... and of their possession. For I know very well, from

bitter experience, that if I were to pick them they would instantly start shriveling up and fading, and so there is nothing in them for me - neither color nor scent nor peace."

St. Josemaria would continue to encourage all the faithful to give our Lady this gift during the month of May: to visit a shrine dedicated to the Mother of God and pray the rosary.

He once remarked, "May you learn how to sow peace and joy in the world, through this marvelous Marian devotion and through your refined charity."
